# **7** FROM THE DESK OF FATHER MATT

## **Disclaimer Warning:**

- Have you ever said yes to a commitment to something without understanding what you were committing yourself to?
- Have you ever said yes to something, and you thought you knew what you were saying yes to and later you are surprised at what you said yes to?
- Have you ever said yes because you thought it sounded like a good idea but truly understand what it was that you were saying yes to?
- Have you ever said yes because you thought it sounded easy and then are surprised that it is not as easy as it sounded?

If you answered yes to one or all these questions, then you are not necessarily entitled to compensation. It just might happen to mean that you are a disciple of Christ and follower of God. You may not be entitled to any financial compensation but, the retirement plan is out of this world. Rest assured if you feel like you are not the first victim of this you are not alone, a matter of fact we encounter examples in our scriptures today of people not understanding what they said yes to.

God called Jeremiah before he was formed in his mother's womb to be a prophet. What a great honor this would have been to receive this calling to be a prophet. Or perhaps there is some fine print to what it means to be a prophet, we hear Jeremiah say "You duped me, O LORD and I let myself be duped" (Jeremiah 20:7). Jeremiah as a prophet shares God's message and the message that he delivers is not a popular one. Jeremiah's speaks of violence and destruction of his people. Those who hear his message do not take him seriously, they laugh at him, and he is threatened with violence. Jeremiah does not want to speak, but if he does not speak it the message is like a pop bottle that has been shaken and the pressure needs to be released, the message needs to be spoken. Not only that but Jeremiah as prophet feels as though God has abandoned him.

Peter and the rest of the eleven disciples have been chosen by Jesus to follow him. What great honor this would have been. Last week in the scriptures we heard Peter make the proclamation Jesus is the Christ. Jesus praises Peter for this answer. How cool it would be to be close to the Christ! Today we hear that Jesus begins to show the disciples that he is going to suffer greatly at the hands of the religious leaders be killed and raised on the third day. Peter when he hears this message does not like it, he says "God forbid, Lord! No such thing shall ever happen to you" (Matthew 16:22). Jesus rebukes Peter, telling Peter to get behind him, calling Peter, Satan and an obstacle. So often when we hear this, we think of Peter being foolish. For moment let's

look at it from Peter's perspective, his friend Jesus just said that he is going to be killed. Would not a true friend speak up, in this moment and say what Peter did? Peter has a misunderstanding of what it means that Jesus is the Christ.

Like Jeremiah and Peter, God can call us to privileged positions. But at times in these places of privilege there can be challenges like a parent getting woken in the middle of the night to take care of a child that has had a bad dream or got sick. Even as a priest I have my struggles. Yet I think it is through these challenges our God has a lesson to teach us. How do we embrace our challenges from the place of privilege to place of listening for God's voice?




**ST. TERESA OF CALCUTTA** Feast Day: September 5

"The time you spend with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament is the best time that you will spend on earth."

St. Teresa of Calcutta is perhaps most recognized for her inexhaustible work with the poor, but the Holy Eucharist is what gave her the strength to carry out the work: "People ask, "Where do the sisters get the joy and the energy to do what they are doing?" The Eucharist." At the 1976 Eucharistic Congress in Philadelphia, she explained: "To be able to live this life ..., we need our life to be woven with the Eucharist. That's why we begin our day with Jesus in the Holy Eucharist. With him, we go forward."

St. Teresa of Calcutta recognized that Eucharistic Adoration is invaluable. She said many profound things about Eucharistic Adoration, including: "People ask me: "What will convert America and save the world?" My answer is prayer. What we need is for every parish to come before Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament in Holy Hours of prayer."


