**SUNDAY, APRIL 14, 2019
Palm Sunday**

Today we celebrate Palm Sunday. It is a long gospel and some of us find standing during the gospel a penance in itself. We see Jesus sitting on a non-threatening donkey as he rides into Jerusalem. Jesus comes into Jerusalem in peace but the Pharisees and high priest see Jesus as a threat to the faith. Jesus' knowledge, words, and actions make him a threat to the already established culture and faith in Christ's time.

Jesus is always wanting us to change for the better. He challenged the people of his time and he challenges the people of our time to become more Christ like. Today Jesus celebrates the Passover meal with his apostles but the sacrifice to be offered is not just bread and wine but Christ's body and blood to be offered on the cross. You and I truly partake of Christ's body and blood at each mass.

In today's gospel we see the crowd urging Pilate to crucify Jesus. Jesus who came into this world to bring healing, love, understanding of God, and peace is crucified. Whenever you do something nice for someone, you can get nailed for it. This is what happened to Christ. How has Jesus harmed the people of Israel? The only harm he brought them was healing and a new understanding of God's mercy and he got nailed for it. Jesus, forgive us when we nail you to the cross by our sins. God bless you all. Fr. Tony

The normal six month preparation period would apply from that point. Normally only parishioners and those related to our parishioners marry here.
