2 FROM THE DESK OF DEACON DON

In the readings this weekend we see that God is a God of all and not just the Jewish people. In the book of Isaiah, it says, “the foreigners who join themselves to the Lord by loving him and ministering to him, God will bring them to his Holy Mountain.” The Israelites must not see themselves as having exclusive rights to the fruits of God’s justice. Instead, all those who love the Lord and find a way to serve him will be welcomed on God’s Mountain. And the Lord reminds his chosen people, who have been gifted with the law, to teach those who do not know the law, about how to serve God, keeping the covenant, and honoring the Sabbath. In the 2nd reading of St. Paul’s letter to the Romans, he tells them that he is the apostle to the Gentiles; or the one chosen by God to reach out and teach about Jesus Christ as the risen Savior. St. Paul hopes that by reaching out to the Gentiles, it will make his own people jealous and cause them to seek the way of conversion. Paul recognizes that Israel’s rejection of his message, may have led to the blossoming of the church in foreign lands and the spreading of Christianity to the Gentiles. In the Gospel we see the persistence of the Canaanite women who knelt before Jesus. She was pleading to Jesus to rid her daughter of a tormenting demon that has plagued her. Jesus doesn’t even recognize her as being present and the disciples beg him to send her away. She pleads with him to have mercy on her. Jesus replies with “It is not right to take the food of the children and throw it to the dogs.” Jesus says that he was only sent for His chosen people of the house of Israel. She responds with “even the dogs eat the scraps that fall from the table of the masters.” This Canaanite woman had learned who her Savior was from the Jewish people. She knew that Jesus could heal her daughter and she even addressed Jesus as “Lord, Son of David.” Jesus responds with “O woman, great is your faith. Your daughter will be healed.” The readings today allow us to see where our faith life is. Jesus is the Son of God and is with us each and every day; if we let Him. Is He part of your conversation when you are attending a ballgame? Is He part of your conversation when you meet friends at a local pub? Or is He just part of your conversation when you attend mass on Sunday morning?






