From the Desk of Fr. Tony We hear in the gospel today, "Now the people were filled with expectation, and all were asking in their hearts whether John might be the Christ. John answered them all, saying, "I am baptizing you with water, but one mightier than I is coming. I am not worthy to loosen the thongs of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fan is in his hand to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his barn, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire."

John the Baptist must have been one heck of a preacher because many were wondering if he was the Christ. John had a big following and he also had disciples that followed him. After getting all this attention I am sure it would have been hard to give up all that fame. John was humble enough to direct people to Jesus.
